creation of a novel outline via plotto

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First, I pick at random a "Conflict Situation" (no. 900, pg 178)

So far, so good. The numbers **above** the Conflict Situation text (ie, (1330) and (1350)) are suggested possible plot "lead-ups" to this situation for my mysterious yet emancipation-seeking protagonist **A**. The three suggestions **below** it (ie, (150), (634) and (1348a)) are suggested "carry-ons." I have the choice of working forward (via a carry-on), or working backward (via a lead-up) from this plot element. Let's say I decide to work forward. I must pick between options (150), (634), and (1348a).

Let's say I pick (634):

A, imagining he sees a fast motor car almost upon him, leaps in front of a car that is not imaginary and is instantly killed. (762) Well, this is an unfortunate turn of events. Just when I started liking **A**, he's suddenly killed. But there is a single follow-up listed, no 762. What happens next?

(762)

(130)(480)(732)(776)(1350) **A**, after his death, receives the friendship of A-8—for which he had vainly struggled in life

(868)(1423)

Ah—interesting! It turns out that ${\bf A}$ is not my protagonist at all! Instead, it is another character, ${\bf A-8}$.

Let's see what happens next. I'll choose (868):

(868)

A-8, destroying a letter in which his friend, A, declares he is about to commit suicide, makes it appear that A-2 died instead from a contagious disease.

(906)(904)

Intriguing. But let's pause here, and instead return to the place we started. As you recall, we began with

900

(1330)(1350)

what happened before that? What led \mathbf{A} 's mind being led astray? I'll choose (1330):

(1330)

A, dabbling in things he does not understand, seeks to accomplish wonderful results, but succeeds only in making himself ridiculous.

And why did he do that?

(853)

 ${\bf A},~a~mediocre~person,~undergoes~a~weird~experience~which~inspires~him~with~grandiose~ideas~of~his~powers~and~abilities$
